2 ATA Working Committees

Each ATA Working Committee is directly responsible for the content of specific work assigned to it, such as the drafting of Standards, Industry Codes and Guidelines. Working Committees are established to perform an area of work identified by the relevant Reference Panel or Advisory Group.

Working Committees will meet regularly and are required to provide progress reports. Members would be expected to contribute substantial time outside formal Working Committee meetings.

Working Committees are established for the duration of a specific task and are disbanded once the task is completed. Members are selected to provide effective representation of the industry and community sectors relevant to the Committee's subject area. For example, a Customer Equipment Standard can only deal with issues pertaining to sections of the industry which have the opportunity to input into its development.

3 Terms of Reference of the WC129 Customer Cabling Products and Installation Working Committee

The **WC129 Customer Cabling Products and Installation** Working Committee has been established to perform an area of work identified by the **Customer Equipment and Cable Reference Panel** (CECRP).

The Working Committee is to address the following areas of review as part of the project:

For AS/CA S008:2020:

- to address the issues that have been identified in the public review of the Standard, including:
 - references to the requirements for Surge Protection Devices
 - use of legacy terminology including ‘indoor cable’, ‘outdoor cable’ and ‘underground cable’
 - requirements for lift travelling cable that us used for data
 - consideration of ‘plated copper’ and ‘copper clad aluminium’ requirements
 - use of different coaxial cable types
 - requirements for the marking and sizes of underground conduit
 - review of changes to cable flammability requirements
 - water penetration tests
 - requirements for concrete pits

For AS/CA S009:2020:

- to address the issues that have been identified in the public review of the Standard, including:
 - guidance for health & safety provisions
 - updating the broadcast cabling exemption
 - definition of cords
 - requirements for lift travelling cable that us used for data
 - review the fitness for purpose requirement
 - conductor size for generic cabling
 - heat rise in cable bundles
 - review of plug-terminated cabling requirements
 - separation distances from other services
 - EV charging systems
 - fixed and concealed cabling requirements for various cabling installations
 - cable supports and enclosures
 - depth of cover requirements

4 Membership of the WC129 Customer Cabling Products and Installation Working Committee

WC129 Customer Cabling Products and Installation Working Committee members will be selected to ensure adequate representation of industry and consumer interests. Members need not be members of the ATA and may include representatives from regulatory bodies.

Membership will be assessed on the basis of achieving/ensuring appropriate and balanced representation of interested, affected sectors. In the interests of achieving a workable sized committee, the lodging of an Expression of Interest does not guarantee membership on the **WC129 Customer Cabling Products and Installation** Working Committee.

Membership of the ATA Working Committees is restricted to one voting member per organisation. Additional members from an organisation are able to nominate as participating members. Unlike voting members, participating members will not be eligible to participate in any vote in the Working Committee, unless authorised by the voting member in their absence.

5 Role of Working Committee Members

Members of the **WC129 Customer Cabling Products and Installation** Working Committee are required to:

- participate in Working Committee meetings;
- where possible, ensure that an ‘alternate’ representative from your organisation is able to attend meetings in your absence;
- contribute to the content development and drafting of the revised AS/CA S008:2020 *Requirements for customer cabling products* Standard and the AS/CA S009:2020 *Installation requirements for customer cabling (Wiring Rules)* Standard;
- assist in the preparation of project reports, where necessary;
- assist with the public review process of the proposed draft AS AS/CA S008:2020 *Requirements for customer cabling products* Standard and the AS/CA S009:2020 *Installation requirements for customer cabling (Wiring Rules)* Standard; and
- vote on the publication on the completion of the content development at the end of the project.

6 Consumer/Community Representative Travel Costs

The ATA will consider on a case-by-case basis the payment of travel costs associated with the attendance of consumer/community representatives at Working Committee meetings. Wherever possible, meetings will be held by teleconference and other electronic means.
